Mr. Winstead recently joined NSCI as our Vice President of Marketing and Business Development. Prior to this assignment, Chuck served for five years as the Program Director for Command and Control Enterprise Solutions for the Boeing Company in Huntington Beach, CA. Chuck was responsible for both domestic and international C2 activities, including strategy development, business capture, customer contact/relationship, proposal development, and supplier/teaming strategies. Chuck also worked for the Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics Laboratory as their Program Manager for Command and Control and Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance for Air Force operations in Hampton Roads, VA. While in this position, Chuck served as the Senior Mentor at the Air Force C2ISR Center at Langley AFB, providing guidance and technical support on demonstrations and experiments with new and emerging C2 technologies. With 28 years experience in the Air Force, Chuck worked primarily in the Battle Management and Command and Control arena. While serving on the Air Combat Command staff, his team planned, programmed, budgeted, and executed all operations and maintenance funding for the Air Force C3I Systems employed by the Combatant Commanders. As Commander, his C2 Training Squadron was designated as the best in Air Combat Command. Chuck commanded the Expeditionary Air Control Group during Operation Allied Force, and he successfully deployed the largest Ground Theater Air Control System since the Korean War. He was also the Vice Commander of the Airborne Warning and Control Wing with 28 AWACS aircraft and 5000 personnel. He has over 2500 flying hours in both US and NATO aircraft, and is a Gulf War veteran. In his final assignment in the Air Force, Chuck served as the Deputy Director of the Joint Theater Air and Missile Defense Organization, where he led future concepts and weapons systems development at the Joint Staff including building the Department of Defense's cruise missile defense strategy, architecture, and acquisition plan.
